Quilting with Your Embroidery Machine

Are you a quilter with an embroidery machine? Go beyond just embroidering designs on the surface of a quilt. With the right hoops and stabilizer, your embroidery machine can do your quilting for you.

First of all, make your quilt top. Then, prepare your quilt by layering the top, batting, and backing as you would ordinarily do. Use your favorite basting technique (e.g., spray glue, thread, or pins). Make sure there are no pins in the embroidery hoop area. You will be embroidering your quilt one section at a time, limited by the size of the hoop you use. Here are some hooping ideas:

- Magna-Hoop: The Magna-Hoop system works with your embroidery machine hoops. There is a metal insert that fits right inside your hoop and an acrylic cover that holds your fabric in place with the use of magnets. The Magna-Hoop comes with a set of extra long magnets which are just perfect for thick items, such as quilts. These hoops are available for most embroidery machines. - Viking Do All Quilter's Hoop: The Do All Quilter's Hoop includes one outer hoop and two different types of inner hoops. The larger inner hoop marked "Light" leaves less space between the inner and outer hoop for embroidery on lightweight fabrics and thinner battings. The smaller inner hoop marked "Heavy" leaves more space between the inner

and outer hoop for embroidery on heavyweight fabrics and batting. The exclusive "Quick Release" opens and closes the outer hoop instantly. Place fabric and stabilizer or batting on the outer hoop, insert inner hoop and move the "Quick Release" down to close the hoop. The spring loaded "Quick Release" means there is no need to screw and unscrew the hoop. This hoop is available for many of the Viking Embroidery machines. Some machines may require a mechanical adjustment to enable it to use this hoop.

Standard embroidery hoops: You may have discovered that trying to get your quilt into your embroidery hoop is quite a challenge, and may result in the fabric popping out of your hoop. A solution for this problem is to hoop your stabilizer, such as a water soluble or a heat removable stabilizer. Then place your quilt on top of your hooped stabilizer, baste it in place, and embroider.

Make sure that the weight of the quilt is supported while you are embroidering. You can do this by placing a supporting piece of furniture, such as a chair or an ironing board, under the excess quilt.

You will find many commercially available quilting designs, such as Amazing Designs ADC-52J Quilting Designs II. You can purchase this program in the store or on our website. In addition, the Designer's Gallery Interactive program, Decorative Quilting, provides lots of ways to transform quilting designs before you place them on your quilt. Read the directions on your batting package to ensure you do not place your quilting designs too far apart.

Serger Tip

If a serged edge ripples rather than being straight and smooth, slightly tighten the differential feed. When the differential is tightened, feed dogs bite more fabric, eliminating bubbling or bowing. It's especially helpful when serging around curves such as a neckline.
