







## Halloween from a Pillowcase "Fairy Princess"



Halloween sewing time has spectacular, spooky projects around every corner; it's a fun time of year! Turn your little one into a fairy princess with little more than a pillowcase!

## **Skill Level: Beginner**

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## Supplies:

Baby Lock Grace Sewing Machine All-purpose thread to match fabrics Purchased standard pillowcase 1 package single fold bias tape 3-4 yard spool of decorative ½" wide ribbon Aerofil all-purpose thread to match fabrics Pins Seam ripper Chalk Tape measure

## Instructions:

- 1. First remove the end seam and trim out a curved section on each side to become the armholes.
- 2. Measure down 4 to 5" on each side and mark with chalk. Then measure over 2  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the side and mark with chalk.



3. Draw in a slight curve from each of the marks.



- 4. Starting with the lowest part of each armhole. Fold under the raw edge and pin in place.
- 5. Thread the grace machine.
- 6. Turn under the edges of the armholes ¼" each turn to encase the raw edge, pin and topstitch it down.
- 7. Fold under 1" the center section between the armholes to form a casing.
- 8. Change to a contrasting thread and use any of Grace's 40 stitches to stitch down the casing and add some decoration to the neckline of the costume.
- 9. Repeat this for the casing on the back.
- 10. Add additional decorative stitches along the hemline of the pillowcase.
- 11. From the sheer fabric cut leaf shapes on the fold in a large and small size.
  - Large leaf =11" long x 6" wide
  - Small leaf= 6" long x 4"wide
- 12. On the four small leaf shapes fold them in half.
- 13. Using a decorative or straight stitch stitch  $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the fold to create a casing. These will be for the shoulders
- 14. Measure down and mark the waistline for the dress using chalk.

- 15. Fold the large leaf shapes in half and stitch along the bottom of the chalk line.
- 16. Add a second layer of the leaf over-lay as desired.
- 17. Make a waistline casing by stitching both edges of single fold bias tape to the waistline mark.
- 18. Do not overlap the ends, leaving a small gap allows you to run a ribbon through the casing.
- 19. Thread your neckline casings with ribbons and add two leaf shapes to each shoulder.
- 20. Tie the ribbons into bows at the shoulders.
- 21. Gather the waist by running a ribbon through the bias tape casing and tie into a bow.
- 22. Accent your fairy costume with additional ribbons, beads or crystals and don't forget to add some wings!
- 23. When you're done, you have a quick and easy Halloween costume perfect for your fairy princess!

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
