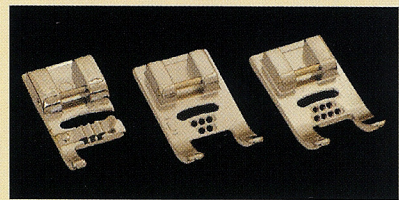
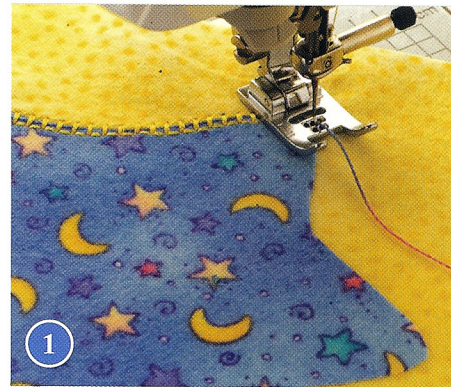


corded appliqué

A decorative detail added to the edge of an appliqué design by couching cords under the stitch.

1. Trace the design to the paper on one side of double stick fusible web as is done for satin stitch appliqué. Remove one paper and fuse to the wrong side of the appliqué fabric.
2. Following the drawn line, cut out the appliqué piece, remove the remaining paper, and fuse it to the right side of the background fabric.
3. Thread the cording foot with as many cords as desired pulling the threads to the back under the foot. Select an open decorative stitch.
4. Place the fabric over the tear-away stabilizer and position the foot along the edge of the appliqué piece and begin sewing. The thread will be carried along as you sew outlining the appliqué piece. (#1)
5. When you reach the end, carefully sew over the previous stitching just a few stitches. Lock your stitches at the end. Carefully remove the tear-away stabilizer from the back.



3-, 5-, or 7-hole Cording Feet

Stitch: Any open decorative stitch

Width: Pre-set

Length: Pre-set

Tension: Pre-set

Fabric, needles, notions required:

Cotton solids or prints; universal or embroidery needle, size 80/12 or 75/11; rayon or cotton embroidery thread for needle and bobbinfil on bobbin; double stick fusible web; tear-away stabilizer; marking pen or pencil; appliqué scissors
