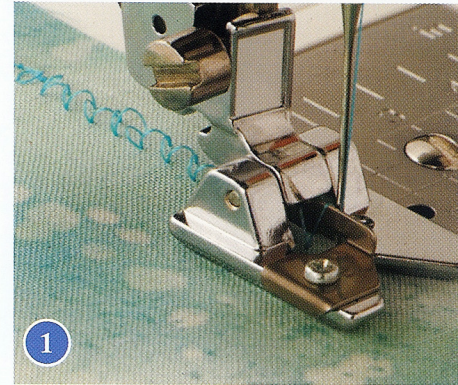


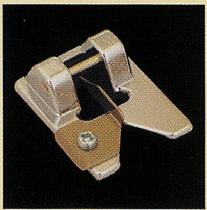
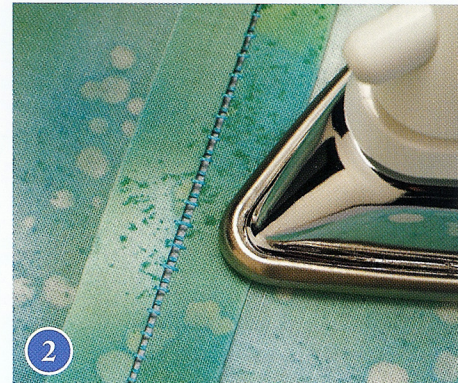
fagoting or bridging — traditional

An open-work technique used to join fabrics or as decorative detail.

1. Adjust the stitch width to clear the center bar. With right sides together, place the fabric under the presser foot. The center bar on the foot follows the seamline. Set the stitch length and sew. The thread will loop over the bar. (#1)



2. Gently pull the layers apart and press the seam allowance back on each side. (#2)



Fringe/Looping Foot

Stitch: Zigzag or Multi Zigzag

Width: 2.0mm

Length: 0.8-2.5mm

Tension: 2.8

Fabric, needles, notions required:

Cotton prints or solids; universal or embroidery needle, size 70/10 or 75/11; rayon or fine cotton embroidery thread for needle and bobbin

FOOT FACTS

The fringe/looping foot was originally designed to be used to mark fabrics for fine tailoring.
