

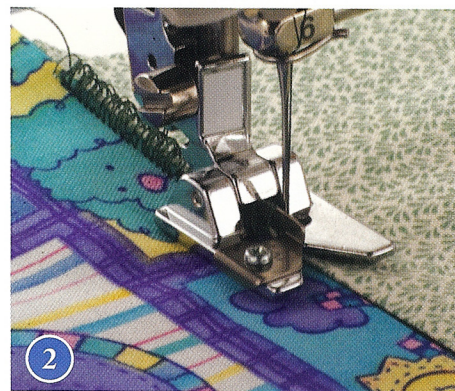
fringe

Fine fringe created with the fringe/looping foot and embroidery thread.

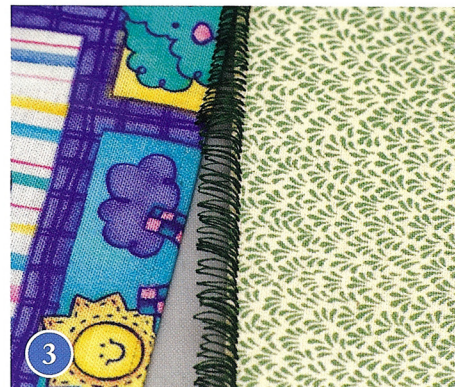
1. Set your sewing machine in the same manner as you would for fagoting reducing the needle tension. Fold under the edge to be fringed and press. Using a scrap of fabric, press under an edge equal in length to the edge to be fringed. Butt the edges together and center them under the fringe/looping foot. (#1)



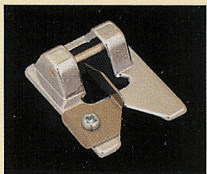
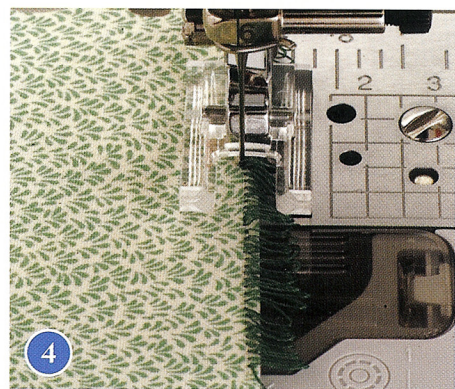
2. Making sure the needle clears the bar on the presser foot, begin sewing keeping the fabrics butted together. (#2)



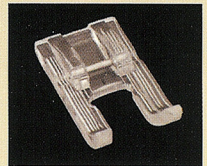
3. Slide the threads and fabric out the back of the foot. Carefully pull out the bobbin thread making sure the needle thread remains in the fabric. (#3)



4. Snap on the open toe foot and adjust the stitch width to approximately 2.0-2.5mm. Gently hold the fabrics apart and satin stitch along one edge securing the loose stitches. Once the stitching is completed, pull away the scrap fabric. (#4)

Fabric, needles, notions required:

Cotton prints or solids; universal or embroidery needle, size 80/12 or 75/11; rayon or cotton embroidery thread for needle and bobbin
