

scallops — satin stitch scallop edge

An elegant reversible satin stitch finish for table or bed linens, skirt hems on heirloom garments, or special occasion wear.

1. This edge finish works on a single thickness. Draw a line approximately 2"-2-1/2" from the raw edge. Place a piece of heavy weight stabilizer under the fabric edge. Use the line to keep the scallop straight as you sew using the wider motion stitches. Sew. (#1)



Monogram Foot

Stitch: Wide Scallop Stitch

and Zigzag

Width: Pre-set and 2.5mm

Length: Pre-set and 0.8mm

Tension: Pre-set

Fabric, needles, notions required:

Fine fabrics of choice; universal or embroidery needle, size 70/10 or 75/11; rayon or cotton embroidery thread for needle and bobbin; silk topstitching thread; heavy tear-away stabilizer; appliqué or embroidery scissors After completing the scallop stitching, tear away the stabilizer from the outer edge and carefully trim the fabric close to the stitching. (#2)



3. Select a zigzag stitch and adjust the stitch length and width to a short narrow stitch. Place a piece of topstitching thread under the back of the foot and along the trimmed edge. Zigzag over the thread to finish the satin stitch edge. Carefully tear away the remaining stabilizer from under the scallop. (#3)
