

MATERIALS:

- * 1 panel Prism (ABC animal panel)
- * 1/2 yard Multi (animal dots)
- * 1 Designer Bolt panel Pewter (contains eight FQ designs)
- * 1 1/8 yard Chalk (blackboard)
- * 1/4 yard Graphite (pencils)
- * 1/4 yard (9" x 40") Zinc (white)
- * 1 FQ each: Navy, Beige, Brick, Aqua, Rose, Sea Urchin, Kelly, Mineral, Dune, Raw Sienna

PARTS DIAGRAM




METHOD: Part I. (refer to diagram for placement of parts)

- 1. Trim the ABC animals panel to 39½"w x 36½"h.
- 2. Cut the Pewter Details Designer Bolt prints apart = 8 fat quarters. For the grey inset corners, cut one $7\frac{1}{2}$ square from

four of these prints. Cut each square in half diagonally. (Set aside one diagonal from each square = spare parts.)

3. Cut two 1¾" strips across the width (WOF) of the Zinc/White fabric. Divide the strips into four 9" cuts and four 11" cuts — one set of each for the four triangles.

Sew the 9" strip to one side, and then the 11" strip to the adjoining side. Trim the ends to extend the diagonal edge.



4. Make a 9 3/8" square template from paper. Cut it in half diagonally.

Use this template to cut away the corners of the ABC animal panel.


Pin and stitch the constructed grey triangles to the panel corners.

METHOD: Part II. (half-square triangle [HST] blocks)

5. From each of the eight Pewter Detail Designer Bolt FQs **and** all the various solid FQs — cut 2 strips 3 7/8" x 20."

Cut the strips into squares (3 7/8" x 3 7/8") = 10 pieces each. Organize the fabrics into distinct stacks = palette. Choose unique combinations/pairs for each HST block.

6. Arrange each pair right sides together (RST). Draw a diagonal line on the lighter square. Stitch a ¼" seam on both sides of the line. Cut on the line; press the squares open (seams open!).



Put one of each HST pair into separate stacks (one for the top section A, one for the bottom B).

7. Arrange the HST blocks as desired or follow the sample quilt photo.

There are 18 blocks across the section and 4 blocks deep.

8. Stitch the blocks together, aligning all seams.

Baste around all four sides (1/8" from the edge), to keep the pressed seam allowances in place.

METHOD: Part III. (side borders)

- 9. Cut the left border 'A' (pencils) 7" x 361/2."
- 10. Pin and stitch this section to the Part I panel along the selvage dots.
- 11. Cut the right border (chalkboard) 10" x 361/2."
- 12. Use selected letters from the multi/animal dots fabric to spell a name or phrase.

Make a 3" round template (using a glass or lid that size). Trace the template onto fusible web. Follow the package directions to adhere the letter circles to the border 'B.' Edge-stitch the circles using white thread.

13. Pin and stitch this section to the Part I panel.

COMPLETING THE QUILT TOP:

14. Pin and stitch the top and bottom Parts II to the extended panel.

PLUS:

- 15. Make a back for the quilt, sandwich the layers with batting, and stitch the three parts together,
- 16. Finish the edges with binding.
- 17. Label the quilt with your name, city/state and year completed.
