## “CANDY CANE EMBROIDERED SCARF”

### Supplies:

Baby Lock® Sewing & Embroidery Machine (130mm x 180mm)  
Christmas Traditions Interactive Embroidery from Designer's Gallery  
1 purchased fleece scarf  
Temporary spray adhesive  
Bobbin and embroidery thread  
Baby Lock Tear-Away stabilizer

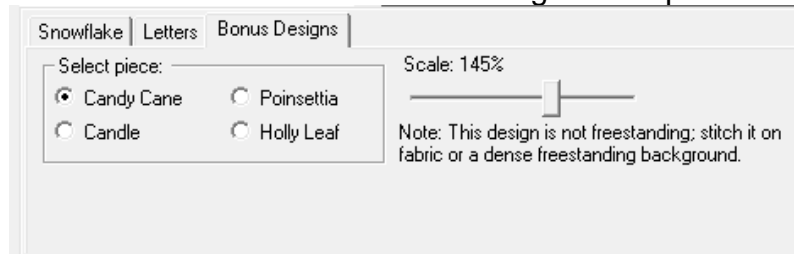
### At the Computer:


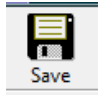
1. To open the program, click on the Interactive  icon on the Desktop.
2. On the top toolbar, click on the Interactive  icon.
3. On the interactive side of the program, click on the Christmas Designs icon



located on the left toolbar.

4. Click on the Bonus Designs tab.
5. Select Candy Cane under the Select Piece field.
6. Slide the scroll bar to 145%. The design is complete.



7. Click on the Print  icon to print out a template of the design.
8. Click on Save  and save to the media source that you wish to use to send the design to the machine. The thumb drive was used in the sample.
9. Pin the template to the scarf 1" up from the bottom edge of the scarf.

### At the Embroidery Machine:

1. With the machine on, retrieve the Candy Cane design.
2. Using the 130mm x 180mm hoop, hoop the stabilizer and lightly spray with the temporary spray adhesive.
3. Place the templated scarf end on top of the hooped stabilizer while placing the design in the center of the hoop and finger press smooth.
4. Place the hoop onto the embroidery unit.

5. Move the needle to position it over the cross marks on the template.
6. After the design is in position, embroider the design.
7. Tear-away the stabilizer from the back.
8. Repeat these Embroidery Machine Steps for the opposite end of the scarf.
