

## Party Chair Cover Created especially for Pfaff



A few yards of sheer, shimmery fabric are all it takes to turn mismatched chairs into an elegant seating arrangement for a summer garden party. Attach a small pocket in the back to hold some fresh flowers to match your center pieces.

## SUPPLIES YOU'LL NEED:

1 1/4 yards of fabric (for two average chair backs) 2 yards of sheer ribbon for each chair Narrow Edge Foot

## FABRIC CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS:

Measure the height and width of the chair back. Cut the fabric twice the height plus 8" by the back width plus 8". Cut a 5" x 8" pocket.

## LET'S GET STARTED:

1. Turn under and press a 2" double-fold hem along all edges of the fabric piece, mitering at the corners.

2. Using a short stitch length and Narrow Edge Foot, stitch the hem in place

close to the inside fold.

3. For the pocket, turn under and press a 1" hem along the top edge; topstitch

the hem in place. Turn under and press a 1/2" seam allowance on the remaining

edges of the pocket.

4. Fold the chair cover in half. Find the center from top to bottom and side to side on one half of the cover. Pin the pocket at this marking and topstitch in place using the Narrow Edge Foot.

5. Place the cover over the chair back and mark the placement for the ribbons at the midpoint of each side.

Cut the ribbon into four 18"-long pieces and stitch in place at the markings.
Place the cover over the chair and tie the sides together with the ribbons. Trim the ribbons if necessary.
